## **Notice of October Membership Meeting**

**ARTICLE VII, Section 2.** The regular general membership meeting in November shall be known as the Annual Meeting and shall be for the purpose of electing officers, receiving reports of officers and committees, and for any other business that may arise.

**ARTICLE V, Section 1.** The membership of the Board shall consist of the four Officers of the Association and (19) nineteen members of the Board of Directors. Members at Large shall serve for one year or until their successors are elected. Their term of office shall begin on January 1 following the Annual Meeting at which they are elected. There shall be no restriction on the number of terms that a Member at Large may serve. Section 2. Each member of the Board of Directors shall be a voting member of the Association.

**ARTICLE IV, Section 2.** At the August meeting of the Board of Directors, the President shall appoint a Nominating Committee of not less than four (4) and not more than six (6)-voting members. It shall be the duty of this committee to present a slate of nominees for officers and Board of Directors for positions to be filled at the General Membership Meeting in November. Names for nominations can be submitted 48 hours before the election to the President of the Association.

## What Hurricane Katrina Can Teach College Park

The recent hurricanes in the gulf reminded all of us of the power and devastation of Mother Nature. We "inland folk" tend to forget that a storm of the magnitude of Katrina going through College Park would have a tremendous impact. Katrina was a category three coming on land and maintained that strength for a good seventy-five miles inland. A category three coming on shore at Melbourne could easily strike the metropolitan Orlando area with sustained winds of fifty miles an hour stronger than the three storms of 2004.

I know what College Park looked like after Charley. Many residents of College Park were with out power for four to five days, but that was still only minimal hurricane winds. Emergency management professionals are concerned that people will say most of us did not fare that poorly in the three storms and think they will be all right even if it is category three hurricane.

One of the local weather forecasters told of the man who was interviewed from Key West Florida when the last storm brushed the keys. The Key West resident said it was only some wind and rain. The forecaster told our emergency team if that storm would have moved a few degrees north he would have been giving that interview as he was treading water.

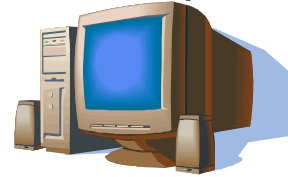
Preparation – is the key to surviving a storm! Preparation is not defined by, "I have a generator - I will be able to make coffee." Preparation means a serious look at your home and your neighborhood. Preparation means a plan so that if you have to spend 24 hours in you hallway or closet you will have supplies. Preparation means making sure you have the supplies like water and food that you will need in case Publix cannot reopen in 24 hours. Preparation means that you will make decisions NOW as to what you will protect - insurance papers, birth certificates, baby pictures, so that you will not be scrambling as you go out the door if the roof blows off your home.

Working as a volunteer in emergency response I have heard many stories. One of the most awesome came from a Dade County Sheriff who was riding out Andrew in his hallway. When the house started to shake he braced himself with his back to one wall and his feet on the other as his roof was literally torn from his house.

The other way you can prepare is by being able to help your neighbors **The College Park Community Emergency Disaster Team will be setting up training classes after the first of the year and developing a disaster plan for College Park.** If you are able, the Red Cross always needs people to stretch out beyond College Park.
