Early in the evening of August 16th, more than a dozen candidates gathered at Albert Park for the first of two Politics in the Park events. The College Park



Neighborhood Association sponsors Politics in the Park each election year with events before the primary election and the general election. This event emphasized the primary election so any candidates on the primary ballot were allowed a brief speech.

Candidates for judge, sheriff, tax collector, and U.S. congressman each addressed the crowd of approximately 50. The significant number of candidates that were present reflects a crowded primary ballot. It may also reflect the importance of College Park voters. The candidates were clearly motivated to greet everyone in attendance. This presented a fantastic opportunity to anyone wanting to meet our future leaders face-to-face and informally.

With an all-American white gazebo as backdrop, the campaigners provided a reminder of the advantages of our democratic system.

The next Politics in the Park event will precede the general election. It has been scheduled for October 25, 2008 at Albert Park, from 6:00 - 9:00 pm.
